# c. Trustee Report

#### From Karin Scholl:

- A new school year is well underway. We hope it was a joyful and easy transition for everyone.
- In our August Board meeting, we had our yearly presentation from our Safety
  Coordinator Katie Doucette. HPSD continuously strives to make our
  environments safe. Although incidents are generally diminishing in numbers
  overall, it's interesting to note that 59% of student incidents involved EA's. As a
  response to this information, EA's will receive SIVA training (Supporting
  Individuals through Valued Attachments) as well as several other
  modules/training to address more specific needs.
- Kienan Wilson gave us his first yearly presentation as head of HR. We are happy to say we are fully staffed this year, but always keeping on task with recruitment efforts as things can sometimes change quickly.

Our Advocacy points are posted on our website. They include:

- Providing timely and appropriate mental health resources for students
- Preserving local governance
- Supporting rural Alberta
- Improving meaningful cross-ministry/local government relations
- Additional points such as:
  - Choice in Education
  - Saving Seats for Rural Students
  - Continued Focus on Transportation Safety
  - Weighted Moving Average
  - Student Loan Breaks
  - Nutrition Project and Funding

- IMR Funding
- Vape detector installation is complete. We are still working on fine tuning the settings in order for them to work efficiently and reasonably. AP 173 (Administrative Procedure #173) should have been distributed for information and can also be found on the website.
- Other changes/additions to AP's (Administrative Procedures) can be found on our website as well. For example, AP 196 - Administration of Nasal Naloxone (Narcan) and AP 141 - Electronics and Cell Phones.
- We will be continuing to hold Community Consultations discussing such topics as cell phone use policy, report cards, attendance and homework. These are small group discussions that will help lead us into related decision-making. Here in the West End, the set dates for these are Nov 5 @ 7pm and Nov 23 @ 1 pm.

- Our Superintendent, Mr. Marran has nominated the HPSD Board of Trustees for the 2024 Alberta School Boards Association Community Engagement Award. We are very proud of the steps we've taken over the years in terms of engaging our community to help guide us through our work as trustees as well as, and more importantly, continue to enhance that educational experience throughout HPSD.

### From Lynn Skrepnek:

Student Advisory Groups

School Council Discussion: Maybe do some awareness to re-educate people. The MOTIVE program tracks school buses and keeps track of hard braking, speeding, idling. Reducing idling saved fuel costs and that paid for the program. It also can help with reduced maintenance costs.

  - Addressed in handbooks in each school may be an important conversation to be had by School Council and the entire school community
- We met with both the Minister of Education Demetrios Nicolaides and his Chief
  of Staff James Johnson on 2 separate occasions to forward our advocacy efforts,
  most notably, our Mental Health Services Proposal, as well as preserving local
  governance, supporting rural Alberta, improving meaningful cross-ministry /
  local government relations.

#### 9. New Business

- a. HPSD Presentation Pam Heckbert attended on behalf of HPSD.
   Trustees Karin Scholl and Lynn Skrepnek covered HPSD's information in their Trustee Reports.
- b. Annual Education Results Report (AERR)

Routhier had 33 responses from the annual survey that is sent out to selected parents which is 40% of the parents selected that responded. This is up significantly from previous years. For the most part Routhier scored higher than the provincial average on most categories. The school has some concern about the numbers in the category about access to supports for learning. In order to try to increase result in future years the school will try to communicate and educate the school community about what supports and interventions are available and being accessed by students in the school. This way parents have more awareness of what they entail.

Vanier had 31 responses from the AERR surveys, which is also a significant increase in the number of responses from previous years. Vanier school saw a decline in the Citizenship category and will focus on that topic this year. They would like to educate the school community about what citizenship is. One way they hope to promote this is by starting the mentorship program again. 24 Grade 11 & 12 students were chosen as mentors and the school was divided into groups. This helps students to build relationships with others in the school.

### c. Elections

# Secretary:

2023-2024 Secretary Stephanie Staudinger indicated she would prefer to not continue as secretary for this year.

Stephanie Cloutier nominated Whitney Boisvert as secretary, Whitney Accepted the position and will become secretary by acclamation.

#### Co-Chairs:

Stephanie Cloutier nominated Tara Lea for Vanier Co-Chair. Tara accepted and will be Vanier Co-Chair by acclamation.

Stephanie Cloutier nominated Alyssa Pollard for Routhier Co-Chair. Alyssa accepted and will be Vanier Co-Chair by acclamation.

- d. New Process for School Reports School Council will work on submitting school reports before the meetings to be sent out to parents with meeting items and just discuss the reports and answer questions at the meetings.
- e. Bussing Questions / Discussion Parents expressed concern over the lack of Bus Drivers for routes and parents having to drive kids to school. Pam Heckbert answered on behalf of HPSD. Recruitment efforts are ongoing and there are drivers currently working on training. Some new transportation policies have been implemented including some new ones, but also policies that have been in place but may not have been acknowledged. HPSD is putting an emphasis on safety of kids. A question regarding bus driver pay was answered. HPSD has unionized bus drivers, therefore HPSD can not authorize any changes to bus driver salaries. Salaries are negotiated with a union. Some other creative recruitment strategies are being looked at including offering Educational Assistants opportunities to bus drive with accommodations to their EA schedules.

After discussion the next meeting date was determined to be November 5, 2024 at Routhier School 7 PM at the Board Room. At that November Meeting the School Council meeting dates for the rest of the year would be determined.
