c. Trustee Report

Karin is out due to sickness.

School bus app update: Discussed at last weeks board meeting. Questions about why the app is not up to date and how it is updated. If you have the app open it needs to be refreshed continuously to update. The app is only updated once a day unless there is a change. For example, if the app was updated at 4pm and you check it at 4am and the update still says 4pm then the status has not changed.

Temperature -at 6am, the Director of Transportation checks the temperature, and he checks it using Environment Canada Stations -takes an average from multiple ones in the area. Bus driver can still decide not to run.

Notification -If the transportation director decides to cancel busing due to weather the transportation director calls the bus drivers and the bus drivers are responsible for

calling each parent to notify. If the buses are cancelled early during the school day, then the school must let the parents know.

Bus driver would lose income if they chose not to run. Thinking the bus driver is paid a base pay and then paid km fee on top of that. Would not get the km fee if they decided to cancel for concern of safety and it was not the departments decision. Would not like to know that the bus driver was choosing to drive based on need for income and not safety.

Glad that we are approving international and national trips again.

Doing policy review this week, something that is done every 4 years.

Board decided not to hold a COSC meeting this year. Due to many schools struggling to have parents attend school council meetings. Working on trying to increase parent attendance at school council.

ASCA is coming up, Karin and Lynn will be attending, wondering if anyone else will be coming from these two schools.

9. New Business

a. ASCA Resolutions:

P23-01: Mandating Criminal Record and Vulnerable Sector Checks for School Board Trustee Candidates

Thought to have it as part of the trustee nomination document.

Don't think that it should be publicly shared.

Who would police it -meaning if there was something on the check -who would deal with it and what on it would disqualify you from being a trustee?

-Generally in favour: Take out the public portion and we can support this motion.

P23-02: Supporting Integrated Education Funding

Not realistic, lack of mental health supports despite funding. Lynn reports that HPSD has been fighting for mental health supports but the Government continues to say no and they were not asking for money.

Would not say no to extra funding, still need more people to attend the positions.

RURAL only -we would support, possibly not otherwise.

P23-03: Integrate Climate and Biodiversity Education Throughout the K-12 Curriculum

Let teachers teach the facts and have students make up their own mind, so that the teacher bias does not come in.

There are outcomes in the curriculum that already address environmental outcomes. For example as well, critical thinking is already in the curriculum and is being taught already.

In general, do not support at this time.

P23-04: Add Rights of Victims of Bully and Violence to Education Act

Possibly not the right venue, possibly more align with the justice system. Wait to hear from the AGM more about this before decide.

P23-05: Required Consultation Opportunities for Proposed Changes to Legislation, Regulations, or Established Programs or Practices

Agree.

P23-06: Setting and Meeting a Student to School Council Ratio to Improve Mental Health

Agree.

b. ASCA Conference and AGM: April 21-23 Edmonton and Zoom.

c. School Council Engagement Activity and Wellness Activity. Thoughts had been discussed about mental health and bringing in professionals to provide mini talks to Routhier and GPV. Planning to send out a survey to parents and then we can discuss it and plan to bring in the professionals. Looking like more realistic to plan to have this in the Fall. May need to ask for permission to move the funding to then. SRAL is looking into training a professional to come into the schools to offer mental health workshops. We can always get an ASCA workshop as well to spend the money.

d. Busing in Block X. Picks up at the apartment buildings in block X and then goes around block X and then exits by the MD building. The road is not graded and the holes in the road are big. Wondering if that road -the area the bus uses could be a priority for the town. Also the snowbanks are a hazard in that area as the kids will stand on the snow bank while waiting for the bus. Lynn – not sure of the Town of Falher priority list is...sure that the area in front of the schools is a priority. Idea -have parent call the town. Will have more impact coming from a parent.
