**Office of the Career Coach/Dual Credit**

-Grade 11 Success Meetings

- There are 10 high school students enrolled in dual credit courses, allowing them to earn high school and post-secondary credits.

- 1 is taking pre-employment on campus at Northern Lakes College

- 9 complete their work at school or home. Most can complete their work anytime (asynchronously), 2 have set class times either weekly or biweekly and 2 join class online at school daily.

- During block 4, Writing 1000 is being offered across the division for students from all 4 high schools to participate in. The course is designed to help students develop skills in academic reading, writing, and reasoning at the university level.

Two days a week the University Professor delivers the course through zoom and the other 3 a teacher in Slave Lake supplements, supports and helps monitor the students.

#### **c. Trustee Report**

Email in absence. We are off to an incredible start to this school year with many projects and initiatives going on. HPSD has started a new approach to community consultations across the division. There are community focus groups being organized in each ward, an online session that will take place in the new year and a survey that will go out to stakeholders across the division. So far, we've completed 5 session and have received some very informative feedback which will help guide us through whatever changes and refining that will take place regarding our Mission, Vision and Core Values for the division. We have been busy advocating for our students, with such goals as furthering cross-ministry collaborations and increasing support especially in the arena of mental health supports. So far, we've sent various letters to 10 different ministers requesting to meet to discuss needs, challenges and successes for HPSD students. Literacy and Numeracy remain at the forefront of the work within our schools. Data is currently being collected to better understand any learning loss and establish targeted interventions for struggling learners. Motive software is being actively installed on all of our buses. These will help monitor things like hard stops, average speed, GPS tracking, bus attendance among other things. Should be completed by early December. We are looking into the feasibility of installing Vape Detectors in school washrooms in our Junior and Senior Highs. Listening to student concerns about washroom 'happenings', we are looking to help create safer and healthier spaces in our schools

#### **9. New Business**

a. **School Council Engagement Grant:** (Funding not included in financials - could possibly add \$2000 between both schools).
