c. Trustee Report

Community consultation, fairly well attended, people provided good information. Results of the questions will be shared. With this feedback planning will take place this weekend in High Prairie. Reminder about COSC tomorrow night. Virtual meeting. Will be going through the ASCA resolutions again as a division. Will be presenting the mental health proposal to the school councils in attendance. Would like to find a time to share here as well with those who cannot attend. Would like the information to reach as many parents as possible. Meetings with municipal counterparts (towns, villages, MDs) –topics =mental health proposal. Everyone was in support – signed a letter together in support which was shared with the health minister and the minister of education. This proposal was submitted before –about 2 years ago and it was rejected.

Rural caucus meeting and discussed issues such as transportation costs, curriculum roll out, insurance costs. Discussion around the learning loss over the past 2 years. Ideas about how to move forward.

Attended in person conference in Edmonton. Saw some great ideas shared –for example, a school who had low numbers (down to 42) –started a farm after a donation of a cow. Used donated money to build farm and all the kids have positions. Now the numbers of kids attending the school as increased to more than double. Alternate learning model. Wondering about ideas like this, are there things like this –innovative ideas we can do in this area. Public schools can offer all the things chartered schools are offering. If anyone has ideas please bring them forward to Karin or Lynn and they would be happy to bring forward to the board.

Possible ideas are a hybrid model...lots of ideas out there.

Reaching for every possible opportunity for each kid –can spread staff thin.

Access community resources for school staff and students.

Busing dilemma –long bus rides in HPSD. ? HPSD sharing busing with Ecole Heritage.

7. New Business
