Office of the Wellness Coach

September has been full of relationship building with our new and returning students through 1:1 meetings with students, spending some time with our SH mentorship class, new student lunch, grade level celebrations, etc. We've had our first GSA meeting of the year and intend to meeting every other wednesday.

We have received the Breakfast Club of Canada grant again this year as well as the PowerFull kids grant from President's Choice. This funding in conjunction with the Alberta Nutrition grant runs our breakfast program that is served at no cost on a daily basis at 10:15AM. The program is always growing and adapting it's volume and menu planning. The breakfast program has had introductory meetings with the food program teachers to look at how we can support one another's programs and make both more sustainable this year.

Wellness is collaborating with the Agriculture class in applying for the Farm to Cafeteria 'Dig In!' seed grant for 2023/2024. We are in the process of narrowing down our project and focus as the application is due October 27th.

GPV's wellness day will be Tuesday October 17th which will feature all of the wellness coaches from across the division participating in different classrooms and activities throughout the day. We will be doing a school wide taste test as well as staff vs students dodgeball to end the day.
